Dress Code

The dress code for the conference is casual and comfortable. The forecast for this weekend is mostly clear skies, with lows in the upper 40s to mid 50s and highs in the upper 60s. There is a pool on site, so feel free to bring swim gear and a towel.

Start/End Time

Retreat registration will take place at 7 p.m. on Friday, March 23rd in the El Capitan Canyon Long House. The retreat program begins promptly at 8:30 p.m. that evening. It concludes at 4 p.m. on Sunday, March 25th.

If you have not yet handed in your registration form, please hand it in when you arrive. We will also provide blank registration forms for anyone who would like to register last-minute. We will accept as many last-minute registrants as space permits.

Transportation

Please meet in the Storke Plaza parking lot at Storke Ave. and Hollister Ave. in Goleta by 5:45 p.m. on Friday, March 23 for transportation to El Capitan Canyon, including van transportation. If you encounter any problems meeting us at that time and place, please call one of the chaperones listed below for assistance.

If you are unable to meet us for group transportation to El Capitan Canyon, you may make separate travel arrangements but might have to pay for parking. Directions are listed below for those driving themselves.

Driving Directions

From the south: US Highway 101 north. Continue through Santa Barbara and the town of Goleta. Exit El Capitan State Beach (exit 117). Continue straight on frontage road, which is Calle Real. Main entrance to El Capitan Canyon is on the right.

From the north: US Highway 101 south. Continue past Buellton and Gaviota. Exit El Capitan State Beach (exit 117). Turn left at stop sign (drive under the freeway overpass and head towards the mountains.) Turn left on frontage road, which is Calle

Real. Main entrance to El Capitan Canyon is on the right.

Conference Location

The central location of the conference will be the El Capitan Long House, located in the northern part of the El Capitan property. Housing

We have reserved 11 cabins to house conference participants. The cabins are referred to as Canyon Bunks. Each cabin holds five participants. These cabins include two bunks and one loft. They also have a refrigerator, kitchenette, wireless internet access, and various other modern conveniences.
